Cycle 1, Week 16 – Durer

Materials:

- Line drawings of animals
- 4"x6" Foam printing plates
- Colored pencils
- Wooden skewers or toothpicks
- Tape
- Black printmaking ink or tempera paint
- Brayer
- Paint tray
- Thick paper, cut to 6"x8" pieces
- Rolling pin
- 1. Look at images of Durer's work and discuss.
 - Describe his style. How is his work different from the other artists we have looked at so far?
 - Look at Durer's print of Rhinoceros.
 - Do you see any textures? How did he create the appearance of texture in a drawing?
 - Does it look black and white, or does it appear to have shades of gray? If it was printed with black ink only, why do some areas appear lighter?
- 2. Tape a line drawing of an animal onto the foam printing plate.
- 3. Use a colored pencil to slowly outline all the shapes, pressing firmly.
- 4. Remove the paper from the foam plate. Use the pencil to retrace the outline directly in the foam.
- 6. Use tools such as skewers, toothpicks, or pencils to add texture to the animal.
- 7. Place the printing plate face down on the thick paper, centered as much as possible.
- 8. Use a rolling pin to press firmly over the printing plate.
- 9. Remove the printing plate.

If time allows, have students make several copies to show that printing allows an image to be replicated quickly and easily as compared with hand drawing.
